

ORDINANCE NO. 11-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TOLAR ESTABLISHING A UNIFORM ELECTION DATE AND EXTENDING THE TERMS OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS FROM MAY UNTIL NOVEMBER FOR THE 2011 AND 2012 YEAR, THEN ESTABLISHING THE TERMS TO RUN FROM NOVEMBER TO NOVEMBER, EACH YEAR; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on February 24, 1972; the City Council of the City of Tolar, Hood County, Texas adopted an Ordinance providing for two year staggered terms of office for the Mayor and Alderman of the City of Tolar, Texas, in accordance with Section (b) of Article 1143 of the revised Civil Statutes of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tolar wishes to establish a Uniform Election Date to be held on the uniform election day of November, each year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tolar wishes to extend the Terms of Office from May to November for the 2011 and 2012 year, then establishing the terms to run from November to November, each year; and

WHEREAS, NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained that the City Council of the City of Tolar, Hood County, Texas is hereby establishing a Uniform Election date and extending the Terms of Office from May to November for the years of 2011 and 2012, then establishing the term to run from November to November, each year.

SECTION 1. If any article, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance, as hereby amended, be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional for any reason, such judgment or holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, Ordinance 236, as amended hereby, other than the part so declared to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 2. That all provisions of the ordinances of the City of Tolar in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
